### **Student Achievement**

- Spring 2025 Math MAP data shows that 63% of students in Grades K-5 scored Average, HiAverage and Hi.
- Spring ELA data shows that 61% of students in Grades K-5 scored Average, HiAverage and Hi.

- Improve student growth in math and literacy for all grades
- Increase student achievement in all grades by striving for every student to make at least one year's growth in ELA and Math
- Increase positive student perception of the social and physical environment and increase positive teacher perception of work conditions.

## To meet our school improvement goals, we took the following steps:

- MAP, SCReady, and benchmark assessments data were analyzed to determine instructional needs for students. Instruction was tailored to meet those needs.
- Math and Reading workshop and other best practices were used to differentiate instruction for students.
- Professional development on small group instruction, learning progressions and new ELA resources.
- Teachers collaborated and analyzed common assessments to gauge student growth and to drive instruction.
- Hands-on science instruction was used with emphasis on inquiry and critical thinking.
- DreamBox Learning was used to enhance math instruction
- Positive phone calls, emails, and DoJo messages were sent to every student and family.
- Blackboard, our website, social media, Do Joande-newsletters were used to communicate events and activities with our families.
