


## **STUDENT ENROLLMENT: 16,588**

Rock Hill Schools is the second largest school district in York County and one of the largest in South Carolina. We are home to 14 elementary schools, five middle schools, and three high schools.

We are also proud of our amazing, high-quality programs including the Applied Technology Center, Adult Education, Alternative Programs, and the Virtual Academy. Additionally, our district offers a robust amount of choice programs including language immersion, arts integration, career technical education, and science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Math (STEAM) learning. 


ATTENDANCE RATE











The 2022-2023 budget process incorporated a balance to maintain educational excellence and fiscal responsibility for the Rock Hill Schools community.

In June 2022, the Board of Trustees approved a balanced General Fund budget of approximately **\$197.7 million** for the year ending June 30, 2023.




#### **SC READY ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS**



#### **END OF COURSE EXAMS**


Algebra 1 scores increased approximately six percentage points from the 2022 to 2023 school year.


Biology scores also reflect improvement with gains of seven percentage points in 2023.

### **HVAC UPGRADES**

In the 2022-2023 academic year, our Operations Management Department focused on enhancing learning environments across five schools through strategic HVAC upgrades. Saluda Trail Middle School underwent a \$5.75 million HVAC equipment replacement. Lesslie Elementary saw the replacement of aging systems, while Oakdale Elementary upgraded five HVAC units. These initiatives reflect our commitment to creating comfortable, sustainable, and efficient spaces for students and staff.

## **HEALTH** AND **SAFETY**

## **FOOD SERVICES**

All schools offered a nutritious breakfast and lunch daily during the 2022-2023 school year. All meals served met nutritional standards established by federal (United States Department of Agriculture) and state (South Carolina Department of Education) regulations.

## **CUSTODIAL SERVICES**

The Custodial Services Department takes great pride in assisting students and faculty with providing a clean and safe learning environment every day.

Our custodians keep 2.7M square feet of district facilities shining each and every day. That's 1,190 total classrooms!

## **SAFETY AND SECURITY**

The purpose of the Safety and Security Department is to provide a safe and secure environment for students, staff, district property, and other key stakeholders.

Through a proactive approach including staff training and partnerships with local first responders, Rock Hill Schools works to ensure students, employees, and visitors to our campuses are safe. Some safety measures include: 2,110 cameras throughout the district, single-point entrance system in schools, access controlled doors, random K-9 safety screenings, and school safety audits by SCSBIT (SC School Board Insurance Trust).



#### **Campus Security Associates**

Each high school currently has a Campus Security Associate. Their main objective is to be the buffer between the students, staff, and law enforcement.



#### Safety Security Officers

Full-time private armed security officers patrol each elementary school campus, provide a visible security presence, and work closely with school staff to provide a safe and secure environment.



#### School Resource Officers

In addition to the formal training required of all police officers, SROs receive specialized training to aid their interactions with students, staff, and administration in Rock Hill Schools.





### **SUSTAINABILITY**

The average age of our facilities is <u>45</u> years old. Our oldest buildings, Ebinport, Oakdale, and Richmond Drive, were constructed in 1949. Our newest building, Cherry Park Elementary, was built in 2019.



## **SUPPORT SERVICES**

The Support Services department worked to respond to and anticipate the needs of our students in specific capacities. Support services strives to ensure our students are present and in a healthy state physically, mentally, and socially. This student development work comes together to support our students as they experience opportunities, challenges, and success in our educational system.







### **NURSING SERVICES**

Nursing Services provided daily support for student health needs in our schools to best ensure these needs minimally impact access to uninterrupted academic and social opportunities.

To help keep our schools and community safe, Rock Hill Schools implemented turnkey vendor testing through a partnership with South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control (DHEC) and Wellness Coaches USA in 2022. The testing site offered students, staff, and their family members free flu and COVID-19 testing at the on site clinic at Belleview.

Throughout the entire 2022-2023 school year there were over 150,000 students served via nurse visits.

### **MENTAL** HEALTH

The Mental Health Department worked to bring mental health resources together to serve our students, staff, and community.

In Fall 2022, the BIMAS-2 Universal Screener was implemented in all elementary and middle schools. BIMAS-2 is a measure of behavioral functioning and social, emotional skills in children and adolescents ages pre-k to 18 years.

In Spring 2023, the Photo Voice project launched and provided each middle school Day Treatment student a chance to learn photography to make their voices heard.


Student Services worked directly with students and their families to remove barriers to access, participate and thrive in an unencumbered educational experience.




